FROM THE GRAND MASTER

Do what thou wilt shall be the whole of the Law.

I used to put a lot of energy into the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator, until I started reading about its many flaws. One of these is the fact that the binary pairs it uses (introvert/extrovert, intuitive/sensory, feeling/ thinking, and judging/perceiving) aren't what they are purported to be. Take thinking/feeling. Not only do most—I daresay all—people function somewhere in between these two endpoints; but they aren't really endpoints on any real scale. Thinking and feeling are simply two characteristics with their own independent scales of intensity, not polar opposites. Someone can be a thinking person and a feeling person. There are a lot of This-or-That binaries out there in common discourse that share similar problems. One of them has collectivism on one end and individualism on the other end and is often used to compare attitudes and institutions such as governments, religious organizations, and political parties. However, like thinking and feeling, collectivism and individualism are really not polar opposites. They can, in fact, coexist quite nicely. Perhaps a more useful scale for making similar comparisons would be a scale of the intensity of conformism. Conformism, as I am using the word here, is the standpoint that people should conform to some attainable ideal, that is, to a cluster of preset expectations or stereotypes.

We as O.T.O. members agree to conform to our collective customs and conventions in order to harmoniously enjoy each other's society and participation in our Mysteries. But we as Thelemites support every individual's right to discover and express their own identity. It is the right and

responsibility of each individual to be who they are, and we are well-advised to avoid expecting them to conform to conventional stereotypes regarding gender, ethnicity, age, income, whatever. We tend to think of society's stereotypes as refinements of primordial tools originally used to help us make quick judgments about a stranger's threat level. But these tools have always been oversimplifications, and over the centuries they have been built up and twisted by accumulations of bad and misinterpreted data, social and religious dogmas, malicious rumors, and paranoid delusions. Letting them slip away can be a very beneficial meditative exercise, for all involved.
